

Garstad named winner

Saturday night at the Calgary Inn the champions of the Canadian rodeo circuit were honored at a banquet and dance. Close to 500 fans and competitors were on hand.

Arnold Haraga, Jerry Sinclair and Gid Garstad picked up the major awards.

Sinclair, a youngster of 23 years, was competing for the first time on the Canadian Rodeo Cowboy Association professional circuit and picked up three titles.

He was named the rookie of the year and was also the high point permit holder. But the biggest award won by this personable youngster was the saddle bronc riding championship of Canada.

The C. N. Woodward Trophy, an impressive bronze trophy sculptured by Corne Mariens of Coaldale, was presented for the first time this year along with a \$1,000 cash award.

The trophy, to be given annually to the Canadian cowboy judged best in ability, sportsmanship, appearance, personality and rodeo betterment, was presented to past C.R.C.A. president Gid Garstad.

Garstad, five time Canadian bull riding king, has picked up the all-round championship over the past two years at the world famous Calgary Stampede.

Gid showed his qualifications for ability and sportsmanship at the Lethbridge rodeo this year when he placed high in the bull riding and also received the hard-luck trophy.

His apparent winning time in the steer wrestling event was missed by the timers and he had to do it all over again. Gid accepted this setback without question, proving to be a true sportsman. His second effort placed him well out of the money.

The tiny hamlet of Skiff boasts the Canadian all-round champion and steer wrestling king in the person of Arnold Haraga.

Arnold also finished well in the calf roping event placing second behind Lorne Wells, who copied his sixth Canadian title in that event.

Competing mainly in the steer wrestling and calf roping events, Haraga qualified for the all-round title when he placed in the bareback event at a rodeo in Edson, Alberta.

Born in Lethbridge in 1936, Arnold has been rodeoing professionally for over 10 years. He's a past winner of the Calgary Stampede's steer decorating event in 1965 and has appeared in the Canadian steer wrestling and calf roping standings for many years.

He and his wife Kaye, a former Miss Rodeo Canada, have three children, (Brian, Leonard and Nancy), and make their home on a 1,450 acre farm in the Skiff area.

Dale Trotter of Clarkson Valley captured his second straight bareback bronc riding title while Dale Fuhrman, Taylor, B.C., picked up his first bull riding crown.

Also receiving Canadian championship trophies and awards were Ernie Dorin, wild horse race; Allan Currier, wild cow milking; Jack Duce, amateur saddle bronc; chuckwagon leader Tom Dorchester; and Buckaroo, Larry Wyatt's Canadian bucking horse of the year.

Leeds United stops comeback

LONDON (CP) — Leeds United fended off a determined second-half onslaught from Wolverhampton Wanderers to hammer out a 3-2 soccer victory Saturday and stay four points up at the top of the English League.

The First Division program brought a slight reshuffle among the three London clubs huddled behind Leeds with Arsenal, 1-0 winners away at Ipswich, taking over second place from Tottenham Hotspur.

The Spurs tumbled to a surprise 2-1 defeat at home to Newcastle United while Chelsea, the other title-chasing London club, took both points from a 2-1 win at home to Stoke City.

Leeds, which has played one game more than its closest rivals, now has 31 points from 19 games followed by Arsenal (27), Spurs (25) and Chelsea (23).

The favorite Leeds played without injured Scottish international stars Billy Bremner and Eddie Gray. But three first-half goals by Allan Clarke, Mick Jones and Paul Madeley gave United sufficient momentum to survive a brisk challenge from Wolves after the interval.

Spurs never recovered from a 17th-minute setback when full-back David Craig shot Newcastle ahead. This was the first league goal Tottenham has conceded at home since Aug. 19.

Tommy Gibbs later increased the Newcastle lead and despite a goal by Martin Chivers, Spurs could not avoid a surprise defeat.

A crowd of 54,000 saw Liverpool haul back to a 3-2 triumph over Everton after conceding two goals in a nine-minute spell in the second half.

After Alan Whittle and Joe Royle had put Everton 2-0 up in the 103rd league clash between the two clubs, Liverpool slammed back to clinch a spectacular victory through goals by Steve Heighway, John Toshack and Chris Lawler.

Toshack's goal was his first for Liverpool since he was traded from Cardiff City for \$260,000 earlier this month.

Calgary took five of the eight penalties and were assessed the only misconduct.

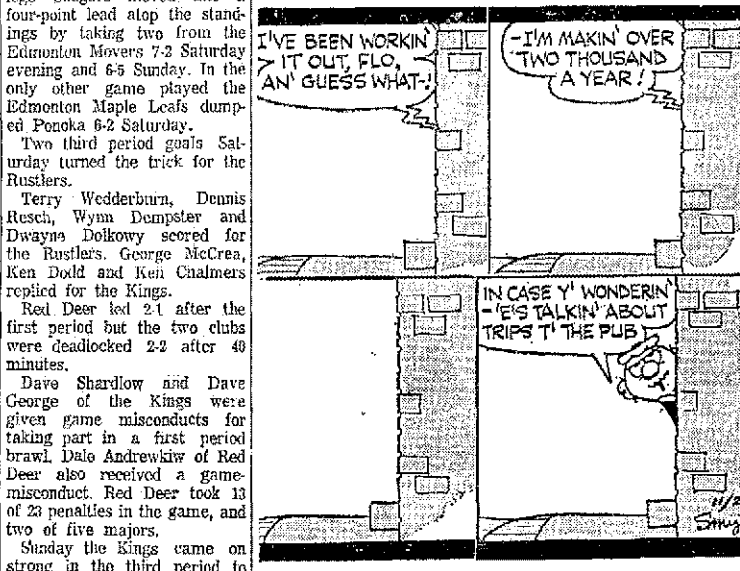
Leguilloux duplicated his Saturday night performance Sunday when he scored two goals to lead the Cougars to a 6-5 win over the Movers.

Boston Bruins tripped Pittsburgh Penguins 4-3 Sunday and Philadelphia Flyers 5-2 Saturday but remained in a standoff atop the NHL's East Division with New York Rangers, 2-0 victors over Minnesota North Stars Sunday and 5-4 Saturday against Montreal Canadiens.

But Dave Balon, with his fifth goal in three games, notched the winner and captain Bob Nevin on a breakaway poked the New York victory as the Rangers extended their home-ice unbeaten string to nine, seven of them victories.
