Theatre companies offer great deals

Have they got a deal for you! Southern Alberta's summer theatre companies offer high-quality, low-priced shows right through the summer. But some days, their ticket prices are an even better bargain.

Discount deals, package prices and commercial tie-ins are all a part of the summer theatre programs' promotional efforts. They're designed to pull visitors and residents into at least one of the region's three live-entertainment houses this summer — and to stimulate more return business.

At New West Theatre in Lethbridge, seats for Monday performances of A Whole Lotta Shakin' were priced this month at \$7.50 apiece. Promotions manager Terry Whitehead says the one-price deal, admitting adults and seniors at the regular children's rate, was designed to encourage family groups to attend. (Regular adult tickets cost \$10.50)

Also offered was a Saturday matinee, with all seats going for \$5. Whitehead says New West is happy with the response it's been getting to its discount offers — and to its season overall.

"We're at least three weeks ahead of the attendance figures we had at this time last year," he says.

At Cardston, Carriage House Theatre is offering three shows in rotation: the Canadian farce Bingo!, the American comedy Nunsense, and the original creation Cardston Hijinks. Adult tickets are priced at \$10, but the box office was selling them for a \$1 discount for the first 10 days of July, and offers the same reduction (per ticket) every time 10 or more adult admissions are bought as a group.

As well, Carriage House offers a \$40 "super ticket," good for any live show for the rest of the season. Similar deals are offered students (for \$30) and children (\$20).

The theatre program is backed by a list of Cardston companies. And one, a local drive-in restaurant, is offering a two-for-one deal on hamburgers for all ticket-holders.

There's still more business tie-ins at Fort Macleod, where Great West

Theatre offers a choice of four shows. For \$9 (adults) or less, playgoers can enjoy the award-winning Canadian show Mail Order Bride, the original musical Yessirree Bob!, the Young Company's just-opened ensemble work Look What the Wind Blew In, or a reprise of last summer's feature Puff 'n' Blow Boys.

But show-goers at the Empress Theatre can also combine the production of their choice with a prime rib dinner and a horse-drawn buggy tour of the historic town, for \$24 each. And if they want to stay overnight, there's an \$84 package (per person, double occupancy) which also includes breakfast and admission fees for both the Head-Snashed-In Buffalo Jump interpretive centre, and the Fort Museum.

For group tours, adds theatre manager Trent Moranz, there's a 10-per-cent discount plus a free ticket for driver and tour guide when a bus of 40 or more arrives. As well, there's an individual three-show pass for \$24, a four-show ticket for \$32, and a full season's pass for \$40.

And for Empress membership holders, there's a \$1 discount on all show tickets or a \$5 discount on the season's pass.

As a result, attendance has also increased substantially at the Empress, Moranz reports.

Further information on package prices and regular-prices seats at any of this summer's venues can be obtained by telephone, toll-free from Lethbridge. The Carriage House box office (653-1000) is open from 4:30 to 9:30 p.m. daily except Sunday, the Empress (553-4151) is open daily, while the Yates box office (320-3844) is open from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. weekdays, 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. Saturdays.
