Judge extends ban against Noriega tapes

MIAMI (AP) - A federal judge has extended a ban against broadcast of taped conversations between Manuel Noriega and his lawyers, warning that the protections against prior restraint of the press are not absolute.
Noriega's lawyers, meanwhile, accused the U.S. State Department and the Panamanian government of President Guillermo Endara of being the source of the tapes leaked to Cable News Network.
"We believe the State Department had obtained copies of the tapes, and gave them to the Endara government," Noriega's lead lawyer, Frank Rubino, said Friday. "A high-placed person in the Endara government then provided them" to CNN.
A State Department spokesman said the agency was aware of Rubino's comments, but had no immediate reaction.

The tapes are the latest cloud over the drug-trafficking case here. CNN on Thursday broadcast parts of Noriega telephone conversations made from his federal prison cell.
On Friday, U.S. District Judge William Hoeweler extended for 10 days his order banning CNN from using any portion of the tape that could compromise the former Panamanian dictator's lawyer-client privilege.
"I cannot conceive that the law of prior restraint is so sacrosanct and so encompassing that there can be no fact situation which would justify enjoining publication of communications between attorney and client," Hoeweler wrote.

Kostelansky chosen new Miss Rodeo Canada

Lethbridge's Patricia Kostelansky is the new Miss Rodeo Canada. The 22-year-old University of Calgary communication management student won the crown she had dreamed about since she was six-years-old Friday at the Canadian Finals Rodeo in Edmonton.
Kostelansky is a former North American High School Rodeo queen, winning the title in 1985 in Rapid City, South Dakota.
That same year, Kostelansky also won the Alberta high school rodeo queen title.

Contras attack police station

MANAGUA (AP) - Former Contra rebels attacked a police station in eastern Nicaragua on Friday, leaving three guerrillas dead in the most violent anti-government clash in months, a cabinet official said.
Thirty-five people, including nine police officers, were wounded in the battle, said Interior Minister Carlos Hurtado.

Members prepared for death

LONDON (Reuter) - An international group of antiwar activists said Friday its members are prepared to face death in the Kuwait desert if the "peace camps" they hope to set up there fail to deter a Persian Gulf war.
"Even if the war starts it is not a failure and it is not the end of the project," Belgian activist Jean Dreze told a news conference held by the newly formed Gulf Peace Team. "If the war starts, the peace camp will be run over and that I hope will be the first act of protest against the war."

Israeli army attacks bases

BEIRUT (Reuter) - The Israeli army and their militia allies attacked bases of pro-Iranian Muslim militants deep in southern Lebanon on Friday, sources in Lebanon and Israel said.
Lebanese security sources said dozens of Israeli soldiers backed by the South Lebanon Army militia mounted a large-scale attack before dawn Friday against bases of Hezbollah, or Party of God, just outside Israel's self-declared security zone in Lebanon.

PLO shows violence tape

UNITED NATIONS (AP) - The Palestine Liberation Organization showed the Security Council on Friday a dramatic videotape of the violence on Temple Mount last month when at least 20 Palestinians were killed by Israeli gunfire.
The grainy film showed Palestinians fleeing Israeli gunfire on the eastern side of the plateau near the Al Aqsa mosque. The 15-minute tape was punctuated by gunfire, smoke and screams. Some of the 15 council members appeared to grimace at the events.

U.S. buildup could take months

WASHINGTON (AP) - The U.S. buildup to an American fighting force of 430,000 in the Persian Gulf will take up to two months, officials said Friday as details began emerging on President George Bush's plans for matching Iraq man for man across the Kuwait border.
Bush was out of the public eye at Camp David, Md., but his defence secretary, Dick Cheney, underscored the president's comments of a day earlier by emphasizing the U.S. forces' ability to attack and by making clear their deployment could be long term.

Attackers described as jubilant

NEW YORK (Reuter) - A defendant in the Central Park jogger rape case, in a videotaped statement shown to the jury on Friday, said that after the woman runner had been gang-raped her attackers jumped for joy, laughed and smiled. But Kevin Richardson, 16, denied taking part in the rape and said he had tried to stop it.
He and Kharey Wise, 18, are charged with attempted murder, rape, sodomy, assault and sexual abuse for their alleged roles in the attack on the jogger by a group of 30 black and hispanic youths who went "wilding" through New York's Central Park "for fun."

Demonstrators begin vigil

ST. JOHN'S, Nfld. (CP) - Anti-abortion demonstrators began a vigil Friday outside a medical clinic after reports that Dr. Henry Morgentaler has started performing abortions inside.
"As long as we have to be here, we'll be here," said Philomena Rogers, president of the local Right to Life Association.
"We've got no intention whatsoever of being violent and we will not hinder any person from going in that clinic. If anyone approaches us and changes their mind, then we'll be here for support."

China dismisses rumors

BEIJING (Reuter) - China has dismissed as "sheer rumor" suggestions that 86-year-old senior leader Deng Xiaoping, who has not been seen for months, had been admitted to a Beijing hospital.
"There is no such a thing. It is sheer rumor," a Foreign Ministry official said in a statement Friday.
Officially retired and holding no formal post, Deng is nevertheless regarded as China's most powerful figure, though constrained by hard-liners since the Communist party used troops to crush student-led protests in Beijing last year.

Attack sparks violence

JOHANNESBURG (AP) - A battle between rival black factions broke out in a Natal township following an attack on a workers' hostel, and police said Friday that 16 people died.
The violence in Bruntville on Thursday sent women fleeing with their children to a nearby town. Police said all the victims were men who had stab wounds.
In another incident Thursday, assailants attacked a bus carrying workers in the Johannesburg township of Sebokeng. Police said one man was killed and 12 were injured.
Authorities did not identify the combatants in either case, but most township fighting has been between supporters of the African National Congress and the rival Inkatha Freedom party, South Africa's largest black political movements.


